



Historical Discovery Hunt

Following the Papineau family footsteps

Come and participate in a historical discovery hunt to commemorate the 150th anniversary of Louis-Joseph Papineau's death on September 23, 2021. This hunt will help you learn about the history of seigneur Papineau and his descendants while exploring Montebello at your own pace by foot. This activity is an initiative of the Centre d'action culturelle in cooperation with the Société historique Louis-Joseph-Papineau. Leave your completed questionnaire in the small red box at the Centre d'action culturelle, 548 Notre-Dame St, Montebello, for a chance to win a participation prize: in July, admissions (4) to the Manoir Papineau; in August, an illustrated book, *Légendes d'un peuple*; in September, a biography, *Papineau - Par amour avant tout*.

Duration and distance: approximately 1 hour and 2 km.

Let's go!

📍 Walk to the place where pizza is king. This building was built in 1840, when Louis-Joseph Papineau was in exile in France.

Question 1- Name 3 other types of trades which have existed in this building since 1840:

📍 Walk to a majestic yellow and green house across from the turquoise blue house near the grocery store. This yellow house was the home of one of the first pioneers of the Seigniorie Petite-Nation.

Question 2- Which family has lived in this house since 1841 at the time of Louis-Joseph Papineau's exile?

Question 3- What was the learned shoemaker's main hobby? _____

📍 Go where the mayor and the town councillors meet.

Question 4- What is the name of Louis-Joseph Papineau's grandson who was the mayor of Montebello at 21 years of age?

📍 Walk to a large multistoried building with an orange butterfly sign.

Question 5- Who were the first inhabitants of this building?

Question 6- What are the dates of construction of the 1st and the 4th convent?

 Go to where you can sweeten your palate and also learn about the region's tourist attractions.

Question 7- In 1877, Amédée Papineau, Louis-Joseph's eldest son, was one of the first to use this mode of transportation to Montebello. What was the year that the villagers saw this building go on its own voyage?

 Stroll along the path that will take you into the heart of the forest, where most of the members of the Papineau family were laid to rest.

Question 8- What year the construction of this building was completed? _____

Question 9- Whose death caused the painful grief which inspired the construction of this gothic-rustic mausoleum?

 Return to the village by taking the seigneurial lane back through the forest. You will arrive at a neo-gothic house where the open gates once welcomed the Papineau family to their manor by horse-drawn carriage. This house is across from the building with the red shutters.

Question 10- Who lived in this house? _____

Question 11- What additional task did the members of this family have to carry out?

 Go to a place of great heritage and religious importance.

Question 12- What is the name of the architect, also artist, who drew the plans and supervised the construction of this building?

 Go to this place in the heart of the village where we can see a large metal symbol of time which is overlooked by a bust.

Question 13- What was the name of the first seigneur of the Petite-Nation, father of Louis-Joseph?
